You can integrate your **VETenrol platform** with **VTDocs** to have it store copies of documents.

These documents can then be accessed within **VETtrak** on completion of online enrolments – this can be a unique useful solution for gaining quick access to relevant student documents!

The ease of which you can manage documents within **VTDocs** means that being able to quickly access or store information from your **VETenrol** system can be hugely beneficial to quickly reviewing information or sharing it with others.







We will now take a little time to explain how this integration is set up — as it is a routinely asked question on our end!








Across VETtrak and its portal platforms, you can distribute all manner of documents – Whether they are forms to be completed, or simply information packs, VETtrak is equipped to remotely deliver them.

- Documents can be stored in a Database
- Students can access whatever documents you select for them, and upload their own work for you to review






Within VETtrak itself, documents can be associated with different data entities, such as **Units**, **Qualifications** and **Tasks** to name a few.





Using the **Student Portal**, your learners can then access these files and interact with them as they choose.

If a file is uploaded by the student, it can be reviewed by the **Trainer**, as well as viewed within VETtrak.





Note: **Web URLs** can also be shared in this way, providing further resources to your students such as websites, and online videos to assist with their learning.


This can also be useful for external documents that are stored in other online storage solutions, such as Google Drive or Microsoft OneDrive.





These documents can be referenced by students within their student portal access — who can then actually download and amend the document per your instructions — and submit it back to you!

This document can then be reviewed by the **Trainer** within the **Trainer Portal**, and even within **VETtrak** itself by your admin team.





You can also leverage the messaging functionality of the Student and Trainer Portals to draw further focus on the online communication aspect - independent of SMS or Email needs.

This can be uniquely useful for alerting a student to specific document needs, such as an assessment task that may need to be completed!


